FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 DESCRIPTION OF FIRST AID MEASURES

General information:	Symptoms of poisoning may even occur after several hours, therefore medical observation for at least 48 hours after the accident. Seek immediate medical advice. After swallowing:	Rinse mouth thoroughly with water. Do not induce vomiting. If vomiting occurs, keep head down to prevent the passage of vomit into the lungs. Move exposed person to fresh air. If unconscious, place them in a suitable position. Seek medical assistance.
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4.2 MOST IMPORTANT SYMPTOMS AND EFFECTS, BOTH ACUTE AND DELAYED

Irritant Product, repeated or prolonged contact with skin or mucous membranes can cause redness, blisters or dermatitis. Inhalation of spray mist or particles in suspension may cause irritation of the respiratory tract.

Some symptoms may not be immediate.

Harmful Product, prolonged exposure due to inhalation may cause anaesthetic effects and the need for immediate medical assistance.

It may cause an allergic reaction, dermatitis, redness or inflammation of the skin.

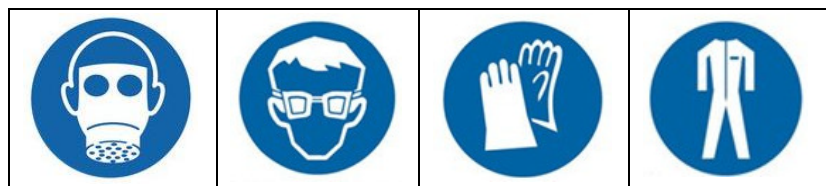
